



CONSUMER HEALTH DATA PRIVACY NOTICE

Last Updated: February 19, 2026

This Consumer Health Data Privacy Notice (“**Notice**”) describes how Foundation For Human Enrichment, d.b.a. Somatic Experiencing™ International (“**SEI**”, “**we**”, “**us**”, or “**our**”) collects, uses, and discloses consumer health data, and the rights available to consumers with respect to their consumer health data.

Somatic Experiencing™ International (SEI) is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization, the educational and humanitarian home for Somatic Experiencing™. This Notice only applies to “consumer health data” as that term is defined under applicable consumer health data privacy laws that require us to maintain this Notice, such as Washington’s My Health My Data Act and Nevada’s Consumer Health Data Privacy Law. This Notice does not govern any health-related information that is not governed by applicable consumer health data privacy laws.

This Notice supplements the information in our general Privacy Policy and only applies to individuals from Washington, Nevada, or other states which may in the future require us to provide disclosures specific to consumer health data. If there are any differences between the practices described in our general Privacy Policy and what we explain in this Notice relating to your consumer health data, this Notice will control.

Please note, some of the capitalized terms that we use in this Notice are defined in our general Privacy Policy.

1. COLLECTION OF CONSUMER HEALTH DATA

Depending on how you interact with us, you may choose to submit information to us that constitutes consumer health data. For example, when you provide personal testimonials or feedback to us; respond to surveys or questionnaires; submit search queries for, or view, certain articles, videos, or Events that relate to a specific health condition; disclose



disability status, mental health or trauma history in a scholarship application, during a training or other Event; or disclose disability status, mental health or trauma history in a communication to a SE Provider or Practitioner on or through the Services, we may collect the following categories of consumer health data about you:

- Individual health conditions, treatment, diseases, or diagnosis;
- Social, psychological, behavioral, and medical interventions;
- Diagnoses or diagnostic testing, treatment, or medication; and
- Data that identifies a consumer seeking health care services.

Unless we specifically request it, however, we ask that you not submit any sensitive personal information including mental or physical health conditions, treatment, or status, disability, or genetic characteristics on or through the Services.

2. PURPOSES FOR PROCESSING CONSUMER HEALTH DATA AND HOW WE USE IT

We may use the consumer health data identified above for the purposes of:

- **Providing the Service**, such as processing your search queries; improving and personalizing your experience at an Event or on or with the Services; determining your eligibility for Services, scholarships, special trainings or other Events, or offers or promotions; responding to any of your requests, feedback, or questions; and enabling you to communicate with SE Providers and Practitioners through the Services. When a User participating in an Event consents to share such information for use in a demonstration during the Event, the purpose is to provide participating Users with an additional learning tool, so they can observe the application of the concepts being taught. Every participant at an Event where any such information may be introduced is also bound by confidentiality agreements to not disclose any such information that may be potentially introduced during an Event. All such information, whether or not introduced, will be disposed by the faculty member at the conclusion of each Event.
- **Research and development**, such as to study and improve the Services and our business, understand and analyze the usage trends and preferences of our Users, and develop new content, trainings, Events, and services.
- **Compliance, fraud prevention, and safety**, such as to prevent fraud, activities that violate our terms and conditions or other contracts, or that are illegal; and to protect our rights and the rights and safety of our Users or others.



These uses are more fully described in our general Privacy Policy.

3. SOURCES OF CONSUMER HEALTH DATA

We collect consumer health data directly from you and when you interact with our Site, such as when you complete a form, application, or survey, contact us with questions, express interest in our content or services by interacting with our Site, register as a member of our Services, or correspond with a SE Provider or Practitioner on or through the Services.

4. DISCLOSURE OF CONSUMER HEALTH DATA

We may share the categories of consumer health data described above with the following entities or persons as necessary for the purposes above:

- **Service providers**, which are companies that help us operate the Services and perform functions on our behalf, such as hosting our Site, analytics, Event venues, our domestic training coordinators, international training organizers, training assistants, and faculty members who work as employees or contractors for SEI.
- **Other Users**, if you choose to share your consumer health data with other Users for use in a demonstration at an Event, as part of an authorized publication of a personal testimonial, or in your direct communications to a SE Provider or Practitioner via the Services. Every participant present at a training is bound by a confidentiality agreement.

We may also disclose consumer health data (in the same manner that we may disclose general personal information) to our professional advisors, law enforcement, government authorities, or business transaction participants. Those disclosures are more fully described in our general Privacy Policy.

5. YOUR RIGHTS REGARDING CONSUMER HEALTH DATA

If you are covered by an applicable consumer health data privacy law, you may have certain rights with respect to your consumer health data, such as the rights describe below.

- **Right to Know.** The right to know if we are collecting, using, or disclosing your consumer health data, to access your consumer health data, or to receive a list of the categories of third parties with whom we have shared your consumer health data.
- **Right to Withdraw Consent.** If we are processing your consumer health data based upon consent, the right to withdraw that consent.
- **Right to Delete.** The right to request that we delete your consumer health data.



Please note, these rights are not absolute and, in some cases, we may not be able to respond to your request, such as when a legal exemption applies or if we are not able to verify your identity.

To exercise any of these rights, please contact as provided at the beginning of this Notice.

If we decline to act on your request, you may appeal by following the instructions provided in our communication containing our decision or by contacting us within a reasonable period of time after we send you our decision. If your appeal is denied, you may contact the relevant government authority in your state. For Washington residents, the Washington State Attorney General may be contacted at www.atg.wa.gov/file-complaint. For Nevada residents, the Nevada State Attorney General may be contacted at https://ag.nv.gov/Complaints/File_Complaint/.

6. CHANGES TO THIS NOTICE

We reserve the right, at any time, to modify this Notice. If we make material changes, we will update the "Last Updated" date at the top of this Notice to indicate the effective date and may send you direct notice of the update, such as where required by law. We will do this by sending you an email, posting a notice on the Site, or using other contact information that we have for you.
